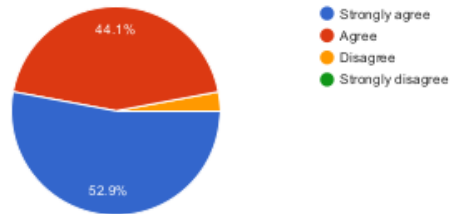

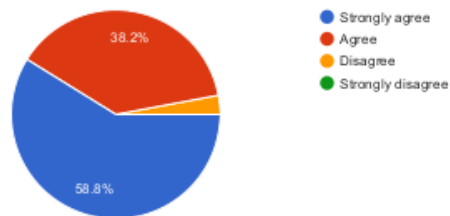
1. My child enjoys school.

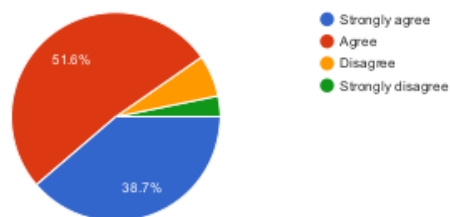
2. The school keeps my child safe.

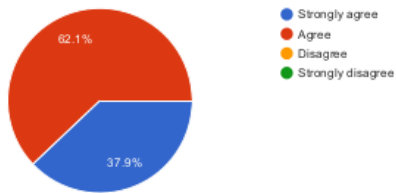
3. The school informs me about my child's progress.

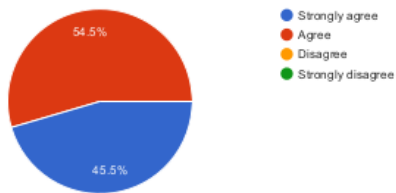
4. My child is making enough progress at this school.

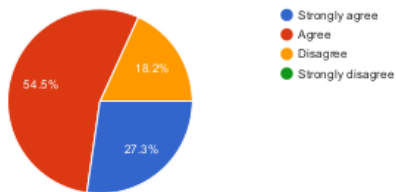

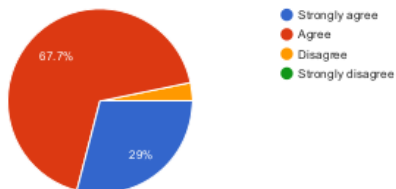
6. The school helps me to support my child's learning.

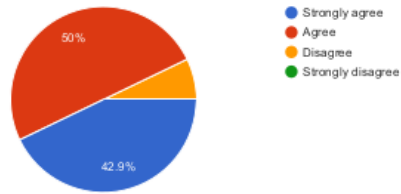
7. The school helps my child to have a healthy lifestyle.

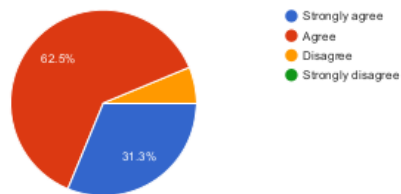

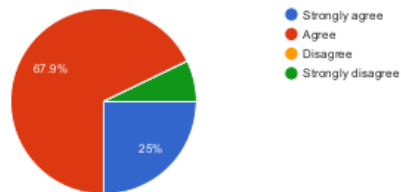

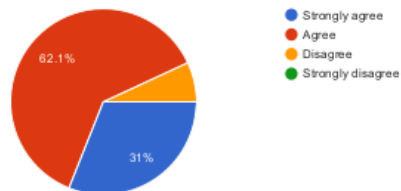
10. The school deals effectively with unacceptable behaviour.

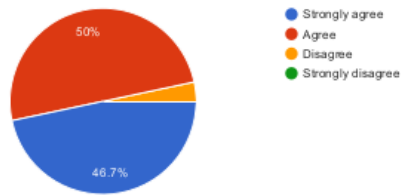
11. The school takes account of my suggestions and concerns.

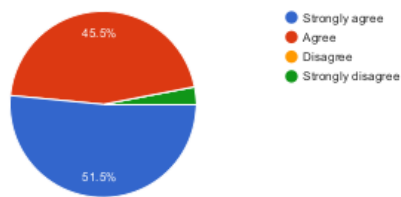
12. The school is led and managed effectively.

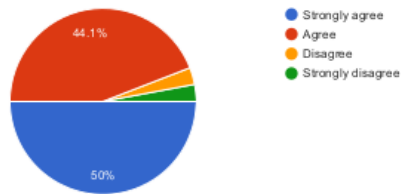

Not happy with Wren Class not always having a teacher but a teacher assistant teaching them. My child is happy with the T.A. but feel should always be a teacher in class.

My children have only been at St Helens for a week so I am unable to answer several questions. However the school has supported both my children and me very well as we join the St Helens school community. I am very pleased we chose this school, as are my children.

I would recommend to parents of non-SEN children.

Bad behaviour not dealt with.

Sports clubs need to be planned better, with prior notice and last longer than half a term.

The school has worked with us and our son, helping other services with his ADHD.

Very open to parents.

I feel the school is improving now we have a new Headteacher and would be able to answer more of the questions 6 months from now.

In Wren Class, the Tapestry App is used to inform parents of what work is being done. Now my child is not in this class I am rarely aware of what work is being done, apart from the theme for the term and the weekly spellings.

It's fairly difficult to give a fair answer to some of these questions from a parental view as we don't generally see what happens day to day. So we only have to go on what we hear from the children or if they've encountered a problem/conversations with teachers.

We are happy with what we have experienced thus far!!

We were concerned Sept - Easter, but since Mrs Rees has taken over Robins, we are much happier.

We'd like more regular reports - once a half term?

We, as working parents, aren't especially kept well informed of progress, compared to secondary schools, and we aren't there at pickup/dropoff to ask for updates.
