 If you would like to continue to work on this topic with your child at home, here are some ideas of projects to inspire you both! Please feel free to come up with your own ideas and always follow your child's interests e.g., making Lego lions and elephants!



Writing and maths	<u>Fact finding</u> Find out about an animal that lives in Africa or Australia.	<u>2D shapes</u> Use 2D shapes to create your own wild animal. Name all the shapes used and their properties e.g. number of sides, corners and edges.	<u>Descriptive writing</u> Draw a picture of your own imaginative wild animal and describe it.
Research	<u>Research</u> Find out about the life cycles of different animals.	<u>Research</u> Create a PowerPoint about David Attenborough.	<u>Study</u> Visit a local farm and find out about farm animals. Draw pictures, take photos and write up a report on what you have found out.
Creative	<u>Sculpt</u> Use clay to mould an elephant or lion.	<u>Junk Modelling</u> Create an animal habitat.	<u>Paint</u> Use the technique of pointillism (small dots) to paint a picture of an animal.
