Our English ELJs will be based around our topic of Ancient Egypt. We will be doing five English Learning Journeys.

- Contrasting diaries of the man and the camel - The Literacy Shed (The Egyptian Pyramids funny animated short film).
- A narrative - The Egyptian Cinderella by Shirley Climo.
- A non-chronological report of life in Ancient Egypt - Ancient Egypt Tales of Gods and Pharaohs by Marcia Williams and Ancient Egypt National Geographic for Kids by Stephanie Warren Drimmer.
- A biography of King Tutankhamun's life and a formal letter from Howard Carter to Lord Carnarvon on the discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb - The Story of Tutankhamun by Patricia Cleveland-Peck.

Ancient Egypt

Our topic this term will be Ancient Egypt. The children will be able to: pinpoint ancient cities on a map, explain the pyramid hierarchy system, research the different Gods and describe how important the River Nile was to ancient life. They will also learn about the purposes of ancient pyramids and consider different ways that they might have been built. There will be a case study on Tutankhamun towards the end of the year.

- . Create a fact file about different Gods.

Art and design is based around our topic - Ancient Egypt! The children will be designing, making and evaluating their very own pyramids. They will also research and decorate their own names in hieroglyphics, sketch a landscape of Ancient Egypt and design, make and evaluate Tutankhamun's death mask using clay.
