The children in Year 1 and 2 will be learning about London this term. We will be looking at famous landmark and the Great fire of London alongside reading fiction and non-fiction about London. If you would like to continue work on this topic at home, here are some ideas of projects to keep you busy. Projects should be returned by **Monday 15<sup>th</sup> November** for our topic show and tell. Please do not send projects in early as we struggle to find space for them.

<b>Writing</b>	<u>News report</u> Pretend you are a news reporter in 1666. Write a newspaper report. This could be handwritten or typed on the computer. Remember to make your newspaper report look old!	<u>Story writing</u> Write a story about the Queen who needs to go on an adventure! Draw pictures to illustrate the story.	<u>Poem</u> Write and illustrate a poem about the Queens jewels.
<b>Research</b>	<u>Research</u> Research London. Hand write or create a power point to show your findings. You may wish to add pictures downloaded from the internet.	<u>Map</u> Create a map of London in 1666 showing the location of the River Thames, Pudding Lane bakery and where the fire spread. This could be drawn or collaged. Alternatively, you could create a 3D map with miniature buildings e.g. Houses of Parliament, Pudding Lane bakery etc.	<u>History</u> Find out the history of one of the famous Landmarks in London.
<b>Creative</b>	<u>Buildings</u> Create a famous London landmark in 3D e.g. Big Ben.	<u>FIRE!</u> Create a painting of the Great Fire of London.	<u>New London</u> Make a model or drawing to show how you would have redesigned the city following the Great Fire.
