Dear Parents and Carers,

In the older classes attendance has also been impressive. Unfortunately a small number of children have been unfortunate to catch the odd bug. Hopefully they will be back to their best next week.

Assembly on Friday highlighted the great work and attitude we see on a day to day basis at school.

Jarryd loves his maths. This week he has excelled at division and multiplication. In fact in class, he was the only child to remember how to calculate $72+48 \div 6$. Most children would have opted for 20!

Alba is looking forward to studying the Jungle Book. Sami recalled the author Rudyard Kipling and Hannah described Raksha's protective character. I have to agree with Alba - it is a great book and the children should have some amazing lessons to look forward to.

Barnaby is another mathematician who has enjoyed solving word problems in maths. Discoverers have calculated the perimeter of lots of 2D shapes including regular hexagons and octagons, kites and rectangles.

Emily is enjoying football and Luke has enjoyed investigating insulators and conductors as part of his science work.

The Art and DT in Adventurers is always spectacular and the egg box dragons are no exception. Alena and Jude have their models on show in the hall. I know Miss Gorman and Mrs Rees are delighted with the outcomes and the children should be very proud of their achievements.

Explorers are still a little shy to share their ideas in assembly. However in class they are very active. I have seen some excellent model animals, phonic work and some very creative play. Arabella, Tilly, Alba and Isabella were very impressive and they balanced and moved throughout the outside plank and tyres in their outside environment.

I look forward to another great week on Monday.

Courgette, potato \& feta slices

Prop: 25 nira
Cosk 1 kr

Ingredients
350 g new potatoes, tidinly sticed
4 acurgettes labout 900 gl , trimmed and thisly stional

3 thosp olhe oil
200 g block of feta, inumblad evagetarian, if needed
smat bunch of mint, leaves pickod and chopped
3 egess, beaten

Method
Soep 1 Heat the oven to $200 \mathrm{C} / 130 \mathrm{C}$ Fan/gaz: 6. Tip the potsto and courgette slices into a lorge bow and toss with the olive ail and some seasoning. Stap 3 Season the egg then pour this owse the veg. Crumbie over the rest of the feta. Babe for $25-30$ mins antl the egg is ocoked and the top is galien. Learee to coal compertely in the tin, then chill untE needed. WO keyp ohiVed' For ipp to neo daga. Cut into squares and pack into : lanctbocs or pionic hamper.

## This Week's Class Updates

## Explorers

This week in explorers we have looked at the sounds ' $\mathrm{n}, \mathrm{m}, \mathrm{d}$ and g ' as well as the tricky word 'to'. Tricky words are those words which cannot be sounded out easily. The children have enjoyed a number of different phonics activities using their new sounds and practising their letter formation.


This morning we had a number of fine motor activities set up after assembly. The children particularly enjoyed drawing patterns in the coloured rice, making letters with the playdough and threading small beads.

Over the week we have read a number of books about autumn as a class and have discussed the different signs that autumn is happening around us. During circle time this week we enjoyed looking at horse chestnuts still in their husks. We also talked about how they got the name of 'conkers' and that the game of conkers using horse chestnuts was first played on the Isle of Wight in 1848!

We have also used them in a number of games and even to create some art! The children suggested we could make hedgehogs out of the spiky husks and so using clay we have made spiky hedgehogs and smooth snails, which all look amazing.

Adventurers have had a wonderful creative week. Filled with instruction writing, Eggbox Dragon making, coin counting, perspective sketching and starting our new story; The Eggbox Dragon.

Hello
It was lovely to see so many parents this week and to meet parents I had not met before. It was great to talk to you face to face about your children. I hope that you found it valuable too.
My central message is, as always, the best way you can support your children is to encourage them to read widely every single day : always checking that they are understanding the words and content of what they read.

This week we began a new learning journey in English which will lead to (and inspire) a piece of narrative writing. The book we are focusing on is The Jungle Book by Rudyard Kipling. I have also shared with the children clips from the original Disney animation and the 2016 live action film. We are considering the different
 characteristics of the animals portrayed by Kipllng which are emphasised in the film versions.


Thursday was National Poetry Day and we were looking at a poem from The Jungle Book also by Kiplling. Kipling was only 29 when he wrote the Jungle Book and It really is a heritage, classic read. He has a local connection too. He lived in Southsea for several years as a child.
