Dear Parents and Carers,

We have another wet and wonderful week.

Year 5 have ventured to the Heights on Monday for their swimming as well as having the opportunity to visit the Bay for their first science lesson in a lab.

Child populations across the country are continuing to fall resulting in local councils considering what to do about the increasing surplus places available in schools.

Below I attach a letter from the local authority highlighting their dilemma and how best to solve the situation. It appears that some schools will have to close in the future.

I hope my attachment reflects the strengths of St Helens Primary School and will help to protect us from being one of the small schools who are deemed unviable and selected for closure.

Dear Parent/Carers,

You may be aware that on the Island we have too many primary school places. What this means is that we have too many primary schools for the number of children on the Island, and this situation is getting worse due to fewer children being born. This means we have to take action to address this situation as otherwise our school system won't be financially viable.

We already have schools who are struggling to manage their budgets causing deficits to start across our schools. The funding provided for schools is based on a class size of 30 children. Any less than this causes the school to be creative as places not filled are approximately £4,200 per pupil, meaning it becomes more difficult to fund the broad and balanced curriculum that enables children to thrive, fund additional support and offer enrichment activities.

Having really small classes causes additional workload for teachers as they have to plan and teach across a potential mixed age or key stage class, which can have a huge range of needs. This affects the standards the children can achieve and the ability to extend pupils even further.

Very small schools have to share multiple leadership responsibilities and as schools decrease in size, they still have the same overheads as a larger school, such as building costs, energy costs and maintenance costs.

As a council, we need to take action to ensure our school system can support all of the children on the Island for generations to come. We are due to launch a number of public events across the Island where we would like to hear your views on the future of our school system. Your views will then form part of our strategy to address the rising number of spare places eventually leading to a formal consultation next academic year considering all of our schools, and the potential to close some of them.

We will be supporting schools and families during this time with regular communication, and eventually transition plans for the affected schools and children. We want to ensure children retain their friendship groups as much as possible and realise this will be a period of uncertainty. However, we are working closely with headteachers and urge all families to join us at some of the events and make your voice heard. We have set up an email address to capture people's questions and concerns. It is strategic.planning@iow.gov.uk

I hope this reassures you that we are planning the process out and are listening to all stakeholders. We look forward to meeting you and discussing the future of our education on the Island.

Since I have lived on the island, a number of schools have closed including St Boniface, Weston and Whippingham as well as Chillerton and All Saints in more recent times.

Due to low birthrates over a number of years, there is still an increasing number of surplus places in our schools at this current time.

The local authority intends to close more schools to balance budgets with small schools proving costly to maintain; on the island most primary schools are deemed to be small schools - one form entry and under.

However as we know there are many positives about St Helens Primary School. We may have few classes but we do not have small class sizes with the exception of our Explorers class. In fact Adventurers is at the maximum level of 30 pupils and some of our Key Stage 2 classes have exceeded 30 in the past with Discoverers reaching 36 just two years ago.

Ofsted recognise that we offer a broad and balanced curriculum and in fact regarded our personal development so high we achieved an outstanding grade in our inspection in October. Today we have Wellbeing Day highlighting just one of the many strengths on offer.

Our standards are high. Behaviour, attitudes, SEN provision, safeguarding, teaching and learning and leadership are all strong. In addition, in the recently published Year 6 SATs results, you will have noticed that St Helens achieved 3rd place last year (one point below second) achieving above national expectations in all areas.

As a community we need to focus on the positives. When the local authority began seeking views on the qualities and strengths of different island schools we must sell St Helens to the best of our ability.

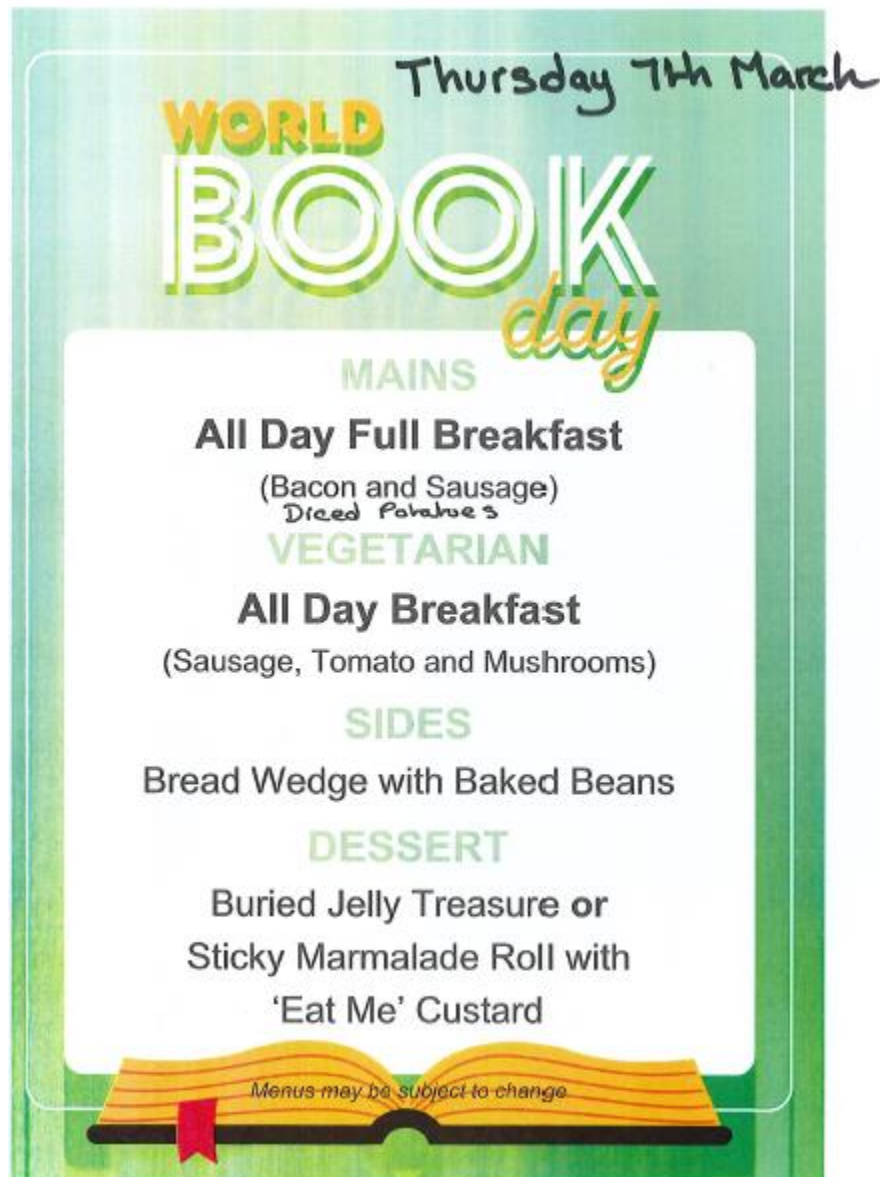

Explorers

We've had a very enjoyable week in Explorers!

The Children all enjoyed taking part in Wellbeing day yesterday. They said they enjoyed being with the older children in their houses and taking part in the different activities.

In maths this week the children have been exploring estimations and doubling. The Explorers enjoyed exploring doubling by designing a pattern on their dragon wings and doubling the pattern when they folded

them in half. In phonics we have been revising our phase 3 sounds, the children have enjoyed playing the bug club games on the board.



This afternoon we have been discussing St David's day. The Explorers have made their own daffodils using egg boxes and tissue paper. We have looked at some traditional welsh dresses and listened to the welsh national anthem as well as discussing ways people in Wales celebrate St David's day.

This week has been wet, windy & wild. Including today's insane hailstones, that drew a crowd at the window in pure awe.

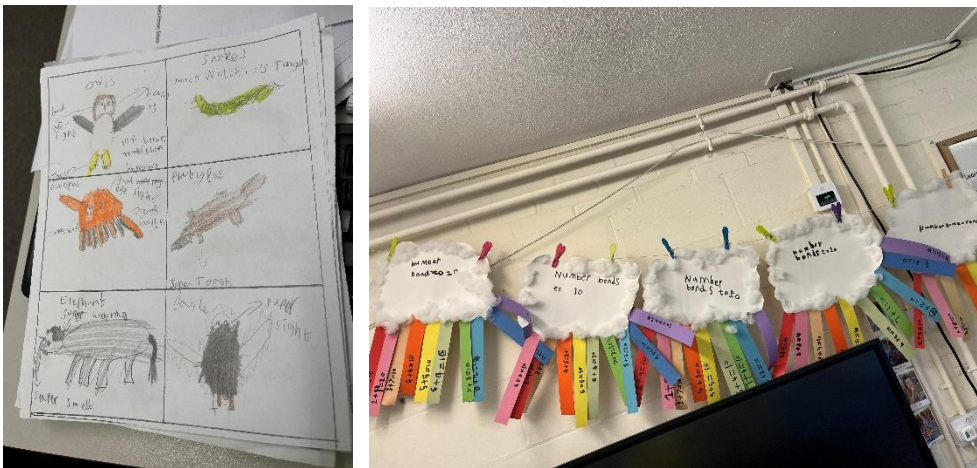

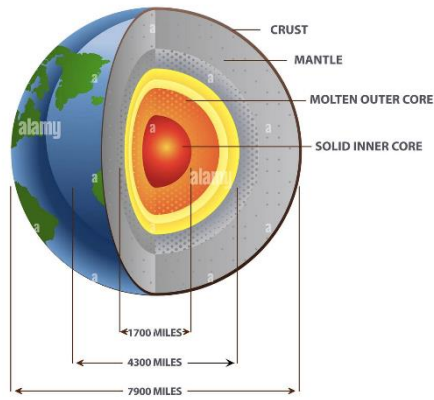

CROSS SECTION OF THE EARTH



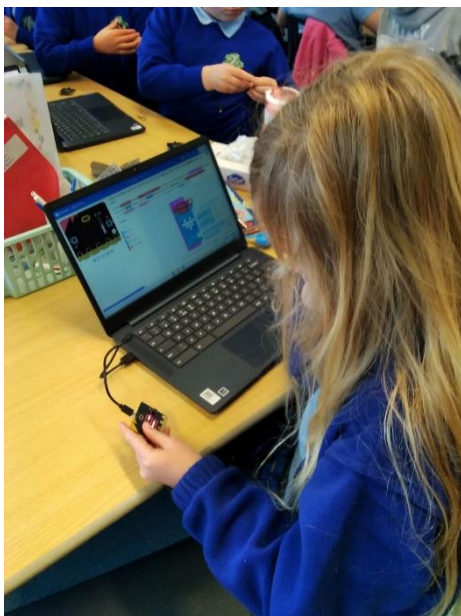

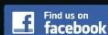
