


School Dinner Menu (£3.30 per day or free to Reception, Year 1 & 2 pupils)



Update

Dear Parents,

I hope you have all had a great summer with your children. They have all returned full of tales about their exciting breaks including visits to Wales, Ireland, Cyprus, Norway, Netherlands and Spain as well as multiple other visits both locally and across the water.

The children have all returned happy and we have already gained two additions in Pioneers with two more to follow next week. Welcome Starlah and Teddy.

The staff have had a good week. Training days on Monday and Tuesday focused on school priorities and the importance of safeguarding. From Wednesday the staff have welcomed or welcomed back pupils to their new classes. New expectations for the year will have been set.

Mr Popple will return next Wednesday. Thank you to Miss Gorman, Mrs Sharp and Mrs Rees for providing cover during Mr Popple's absence.

We welcome Mrs Pierrepont to Pioneers. Her knowledge, skills and experience will support the school as we move forward. I'm pleased to see she has settled in very well and has enjoyed her first few days with us.

We also welcome Mrs Pike and Mrs Laverty who will be supporting Mrs Taylor during lunchtimes. This has made a difference and both staff have settled in well.

In the next few days/weeks we will provide more details of what the teachers plan to teach during the term. I know the staff are looking forward to providing lots of new and exciting events for the pupils in addition to building on previous learning of course.

Later in the year some children may be able to look forward to the proposed residential and class visits. However in the shorter term we can look forward to Harvest Festival, parent's evenings and a selection of clubs both new and old.
