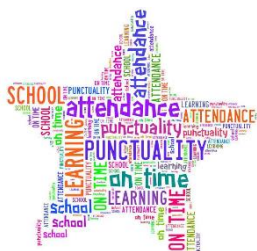



This Week's Class Updates



Explorers

It has been so lovely to see the children back this week! We have started our topic about people who help us, but have also explored elements of Winter, going on a cold walk outside looking for ice and frost and exploring ice balloons and what happens when you sprinkle salt on them and if they stay out of the freezer. We used lots of good words to describe how they felt before and after we put the salt on. The children made some beautiful frosty pictures for our display board too.

We looked at our next 'No Outsiders' book with the theme that we can like different things and still be friends with each other.

We have done some revision of phase 2 sounds and tricky words and started phase 3 sounds with /j/ and /v/ this week. We have also investigated the number 7 this week and different ways we can see 7 items, make seven using two numbers and how to write it. We loved using numicon for our investigations.

We have also got a bulb that we are growing in the classroom, hoping that it will grow into a beautiful amaryllis! We will see how much it grows each week.





Adventurers

What a busy week it has been,

We have been doing lots of addition and subtraction in maths. Using part whole models and bar models. Ending the week with a mini test that all children tried really hard and did really well with.

English has focused around our new book Vlad and the great fire of London. We have dug deep into key terms such as adjectives, verbs and time adverbials. This is such a hard skill for Year 1 and 2 children but they are doing so well and it has really improved their writing.

In our other subjects we have been focusing on a lot of tricky spellings in phonics, PSHE has been about the importance of sleep, science has been all about different materials and history involved creating a timeline of key people and events in British history.

Discoverers

What a wonderful, albeit windy, week. We've started our new topic: The Stone Age, and everyone seems equally as enthralled as they were with Ancient Egypt. As an update: I will be sending home a letter inviting parents and carers into school on Friday 30th January, as we will be showcasing the classes Egyptian work & creations. I wanted to do this before Christmas, but numbers were low due to seasonal illnesses, so we postponed. I'd also like to remove the 30+ mummified bananas from on top of my fridge... Full details to follow!

In Science we have been exploring electricity and making electrical circuits. Ruby loved seeing if she could add a second light source to hers. Daniel was a dab hand at connecting wires.

In Maths we have been using digital and analogue clocks! Please, please, please if you get the chance, can you also be pointing out the time and discussing this at home too? We love working with time, but we find that they can easily lose this new skill if it's not in everyday life. So we would adore it, if they were also practising at home. Specifically at recognising; quarter to, quarter past, past, to, etc.

In English we have started Stone Age Boy and the children have enjoyed making predictions about the text, and learning more about Stone Age norms. The children will be working towards writing a narrative where a stone age child comes into our world and experiences our norms.

In Art the children have been creating mixed media cave paintings, as we will also be focussing on the Stone Age as our creative source. The children have adored layering their different mediums to produce cave worthy creations.

We've had a lovely start to the new term and can't wait to see what the rest of 2026 brings!
